

# Overall Goal of the Coalition of Action 4 Soil Health (CA4SH)

To improve soil health globally by addressing critical implementation, monitoring, policy, and investment barriers that constrain farmers from scaling healthy soil practices.

The four targets of the Coalition:

- Integrate soil health considerations in policy across the development, environment, agriculture and climate change domains.
- **Expand research in development** on soil health practices and monitoring.
- Significantly **increase** the number of hectares of **land under healthy soil practices**.
- Significantly **increase investments in soil health**, by a margin of 5-10 fold above current financing commitments.





COP28 PRESIDENCY PUTS FOOD SYSTEMS TRANSFORMATION ON GLOBAL CLIMATE AGENDA AS MORE THAN 130 WORLD LEADERS ENDORSE FOOD AND AGRICULTURE DECLARATION which includes "enhancing soil health"



#### Background

The Roundtable Luncheon will explore the question of how global agreements can be translated to national level implementation and what role UNEA Resolutions can play into this context. For example linking Land Degradation Neutrality targets, Ecosystem Restoration targets, Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), Global Biodiversity Framework, and Agricultural Strategies to scale implementation on the ground. Food system transformation and land restoration are key to harmonising action between the Rio conventions to achieve climate, biodiversity and land targets.

This event will place special focus on integrating soil health and food systems to strengthen Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs), and National Adaptation Plans (NAPs).

#### What is Soil Health?

Soil Health is the capacity of soils to facilitate the production of provisioning, supporting, regulating, and cultural ecosystem services such as climate change mitigation and adaptation, biodiversity conservation and habit provision as well as nutrient cycling, plant productivity, water regulation and purification.

#### Why is Soil Health important?

Approximately 95 percent of food is directly or indirectly grown in the soil. However, one third of arable soil has been lost and on a global scale the annual loss of 75 billion tons of soil costs the world about \$400 billion per year (GSP). Soil Health is the foundation of food systems and improvements. From being the world's largest driver of soil degradation to its greater restorer, Soil Health can be an important catalyst to shift global agriculture.

#### Why is it important to monitor Soil Health?

Soil Health monitoring is vital not only to better understand the effects of agricultural practices on ecosystem services but also to highlight areas for improvement, develop strategies to maximize synergistic effects while minimizing potential trade-offs. The data gathered during Soil Health monitoring is crucial in guiding decisions for adopting and promoting sustainable land management practices and formulating policies aimed at advancing Soil Health.
